To Whom It May Concern,

I write in support of Mr. Kurtzke's objections to discriminatory discrimination policies at University of British Columbia.

I've studied the ideological profile of academia in the United States. A groupthink dynamic is built on three main pillars: Majoritarian departmental politics, the pyramidal structure of disciplines, and the sacred nature of political beliefs. Once leftism became preponderant, these three factors have driven the system toward uniformity, and now there are virtually no non-left people in the academy. The result is a fragility that cannot brook dissent from leftism.
